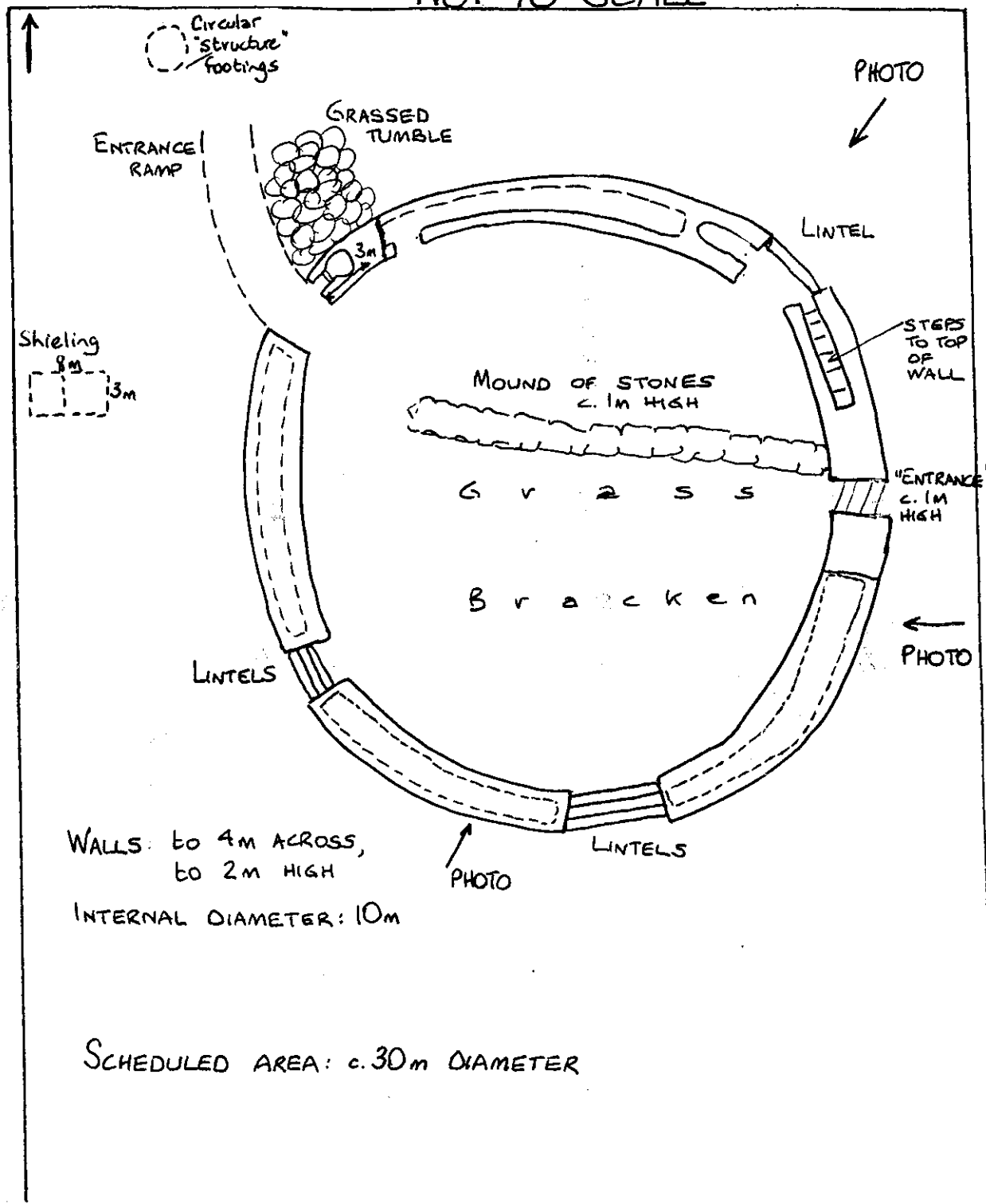

The monument known as Dun Fiadhairt, dun comprises a broch situated on a coastal promontory. The area to be scheduled is a circle 50m in diameter, which includes the remains of the broch and an area around in which traces of activities associated with the construction and use of the broch may survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Duirinish and the County of Inverness as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part of the subjects described in the Feu Charter by Flora, Mrs Macleod of Macleod in favour of the Secretary of State for Scotland dated 29 May and recorded in the Division of the General Register of Sasines for the County of Inverness on 10 July both in the year 1941 (the present owner whereof being the Secretary of State for Scotland per The Scottish Office Agriculture, Environment and Fisheries Department, Pentland House, 47 Robb's Loan, Edinburgh EH14 1TW), is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

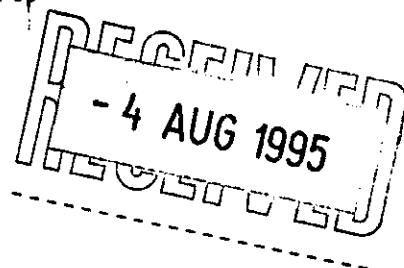

I refer to your application for scheduled monument consent to undertake works as detailed in your application, including clearance of rubble, resetting of stonework and repair to partially collapsed area at the above scheduled ancient monument.

You indicated that a hearing is not requested before the Secretary of State determines whether or not to grant scheduled monument consent.

The Secretary of State is satisfied that the works summarised above can be carried out without detriment to the historic, archaeological or architectural integrity of the monument. **Accordingly, he hereby grants scheduled monument consent** for the works outlined in the application dated 25 April.

Consent is granted subject to the undernoted conditions:

1. The works to which this consent relates shall be carried out to the satisfaction of the Secretary of State, who will be advised by Historic Scotland.
2. That when the work on site is complete, the DULCHAS Museum Service shall inform the Inspector of Ancient Monuments, Dr Richard Hingley (telephone: 0131 668 8659) so that he can arrange to ensure that the work has been carried out in line with this consent.



3. The programme of work to consolidate the collapsed jambs at the entrance to the north-west cell shall be carried out by Mr Martin Wildgoose and shall be as specified in his project design of 25 June 1991. The work shall involve the clearance of fallen stone, rubble and earth, the removing of unstable stone-work and the resetting of this stone. The jambs to the north-west internal door opening shall be rebuilt in dry-stone to match the existing structure.

4. A full photographic record shall be taken of the area that is to be consolidated, both before and after the work is complete.

5. One copy of a short report on the work and a copy of the photographic record shall be sent to Historic Scotland, the Regional Archaeologist and the National Monuments Record within 3 months of the completion of work on site. A short report shall be submitted to *Discovery and Excavation in Scotland 1995*.

6. That any artefacts recovered shall be declared for possible Treasure Trove action. If they are not so claimed, then they shall be disposed of upon the advice of the Finds Disposal Panel.

The consolidation should prevent further deterioration to the structure of the broch. The purpose of these conditions is to ensure that the consolidation of the broch is carried out without any unnecessary impact on the historic structure of the monument.

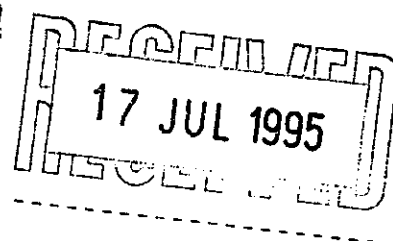

I refer to your application for scheduled monument consent of 25 April to undertake works as detailed in your application, including clearance of rubble, resetting of stonework and repair to partially collapsed area at the above scheduled ancient monument.

In the terms of Part 1 of Schedule 1 to the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979, before determining whether or not to grant scheduled monument consent the Secretary of State must provide you with an opportunity to appear before and be heard by a person appointed for that purpose. This right to a hearing can also be extended to any other person whom the Secretary of State considers has an interest.

To enable you to decide whether or not to exercise your statutory right to a hearing, which would normally take the form of a public local inquiry, I can advise you that on the basis of the information at present available and the advice given to the Secretary of State, **he is minded to grant scheduled monument consent** subject to the undernoted conditions:-

1. The works to which this consent relates shall be carried out to the satisfaction of the Secretary of State, who will be advised by Historic Scotland.

If you wish to contest the above advice you may use your statutory right to a hearing as set out above. Any request for a hearing should be made within 28 days of the date of this letter. Alternatively, instead of a hearing you may wish to submit written representations in support of your application.

If I do not have a reply from you within 28 days either requesting a hearing or making representations, the Secretary of State shall proceed to a final determination of the matter and his decision will be notified to you.

A form of reply and a pre-paid self addressed envelope is enclosed for your use.



I must remind you that no works may be undertaken without a formal grant of scheduled monument consent.

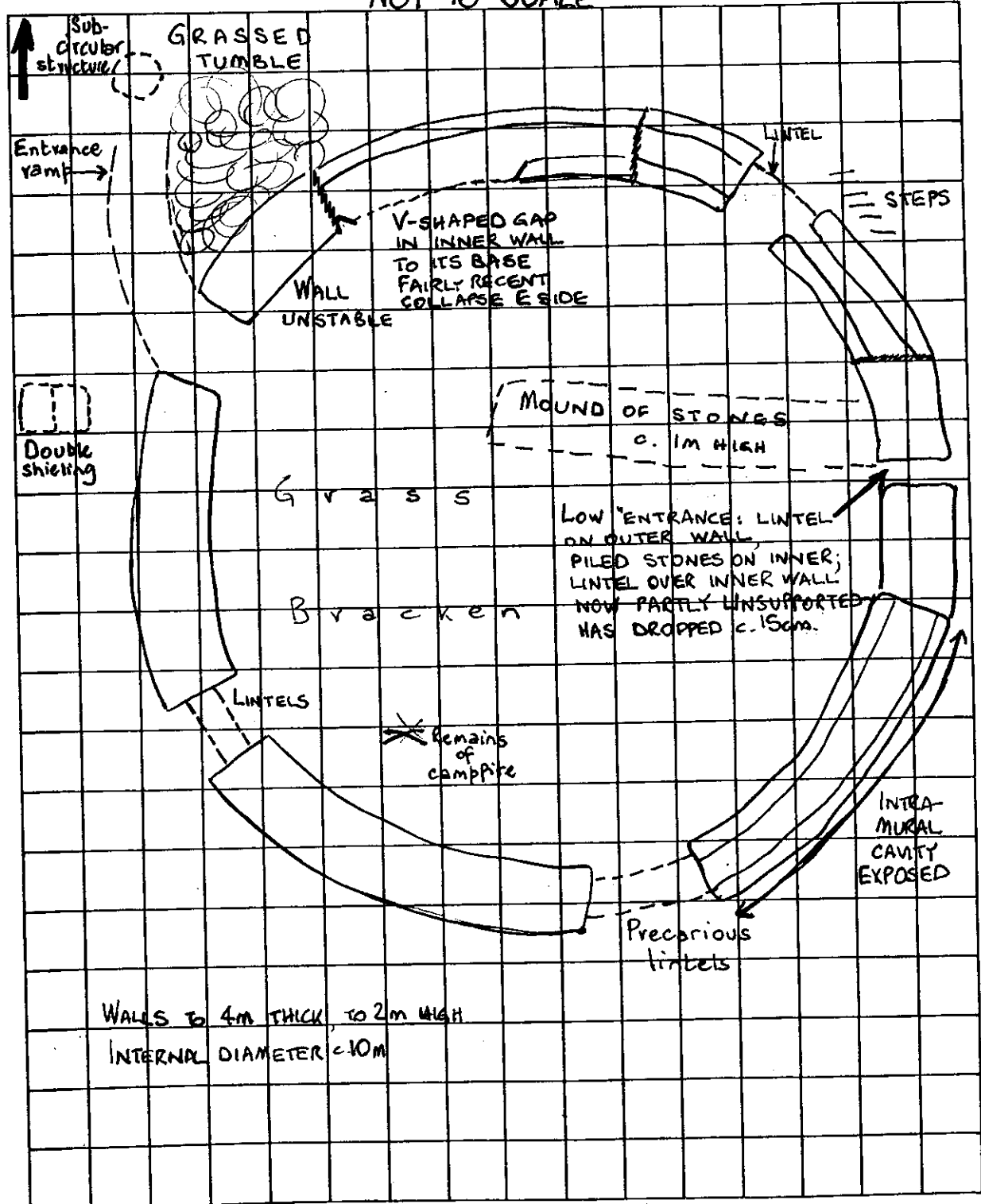

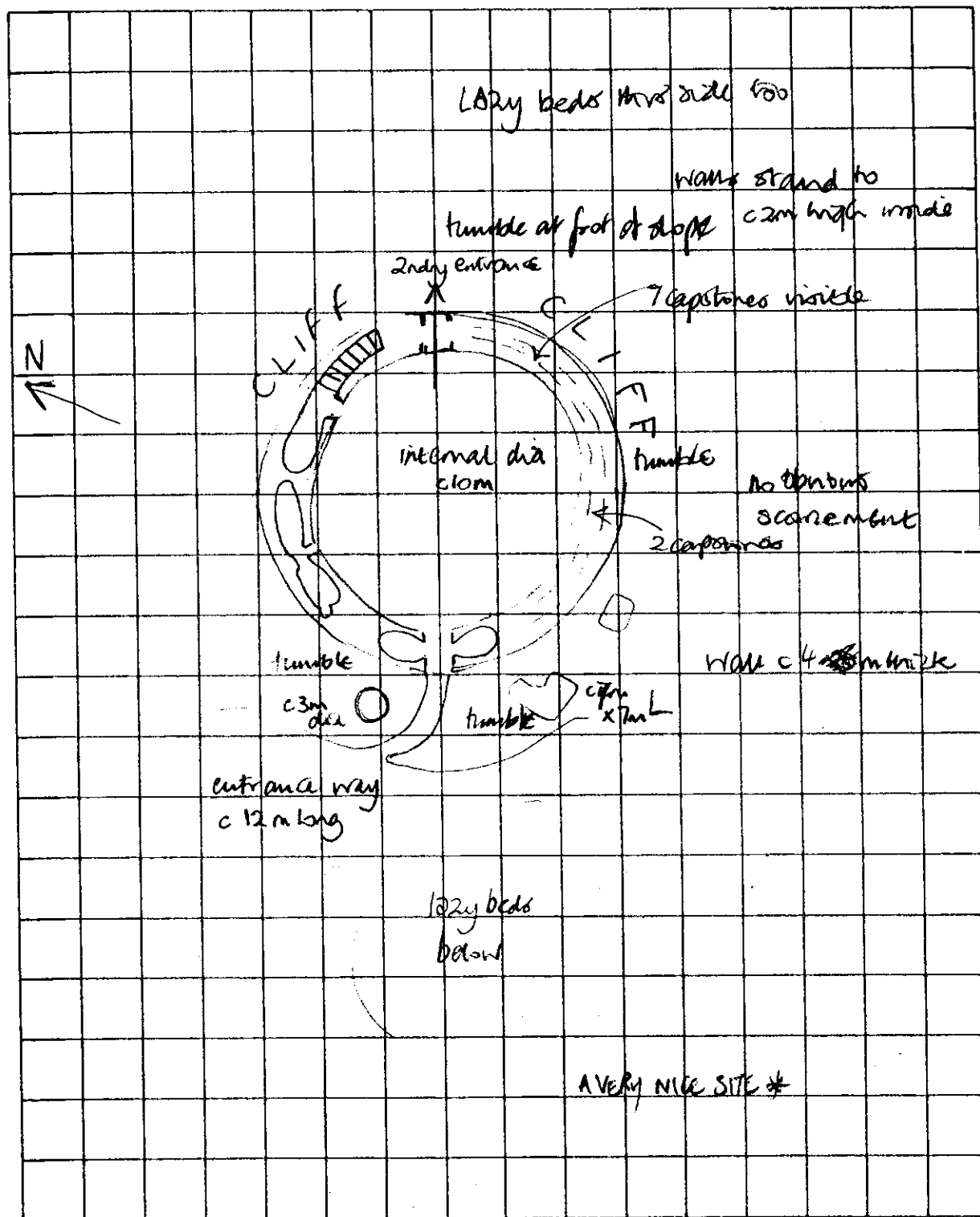

Dun Fiadhairt, a broch, measures 31ft internally within a wall up to 12ft thick. The entrance in the W is checked for a door and fitted with two communicating cells. Another cell lies in the NW sector of the wall, and the stair-lobby in the N, while a gallery occupies the E and S sectors (R W Feachem 1963).

Excavated in 1914 (F T Macleod 1915). Finds included an amber necklace, various beads with one dating from probably 2nd century AD., and a terra-cotta model of a bale of wool indicating trade links with Romanized Britain.

Dun Fiadhairt, as described above. Largely cleared of debris, good condition.

Mann and Curle note the discovery of a small terra-cotta votive offering in the form of a model of a bale of hides or fleeces at the broch and suggest that it was probably brought by a trader from the south during the Roman period, as the local population did not use terra-cotta.

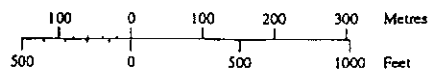
